THE ASSASSINATION OF JFK

November 22, 1963. It is a date that lives in the memory of millions around the world, the date that John F. Kennedy, 35th president of the United States, was murdered during a motorcade in Dealey Plaza, a park in Dallas, Texas. Two days later, the prime suspect in the assassination, Lee Harvey Oswald, was gunned down in the basement of the Dallas Police Department. Cumulatively, those four days in November changed world history, and established a legacy of controversy that will endure into the new millennium.

Join us on a unique, detailed examination of this historic weekend in Dallas, where you will visit rarely-seen private and public sites associated with the assassination and its aftermath, talk with original witnesses, and go behind the scenes at the award-winning Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza, the nation's premier historic site dedicated to the life, death, times and legacy of JFK. Historian Guide Conover Hunt, who directed the effort to create the museum and preserve Dealey Plaza, will lead us, through the trauma and tragedy of the weekend, and offer the participant objective guidance into a better understanding of this complicated and confusing series of events.

This combination tour and symposium is a first for HistoryAmerica TOURS. We will not take sides on the issue of President Kennedy's effectiveness as a leader, his character, or the reasons for his death. With the assistance of skilled interpreters and witnesses to the event, we will seek to gain a more satisfactory answer to the question: What happened?



Wednesday, April 12 Gathering day at the Hyatt Regency Dallas where we'll stay for the next four nights. Welcome briefing and dinner that evening hosted by HistoryAmerica TOURS and Historian Guide Conover Hunt.

Thursday, April 13 We spend the morning at the Sixth Floor Museum. We will be welcomed by Museum Director Jeff West. After a tour of the Museum, Archivist Gary Mack will show seldom-seen video of local news reports. The afternoon symposium will feature talks by Hugh Aynesworth, the only reporter to witness the assassination, cover the Tippit murder and Oswald's arrest at the Texas Theater; Jim Charlton, who will explain the history of Dealey Plaza and its designation as a National Historic Landmark; and Conover Hunt who will outline the organization of the Sixth Floor Museum. Following a group dinner at the museum, the HistoryAmerica hospitality room at the Hyatt will be open for a late evening informal question and answer session with the historians.

Friday, April 14 The touring will begin, led by noted researcher and historian Dave Perry. The morning tour will consist of following JFK's motorcade from Love Field, through Dealey Plaza to Parkland Hospital. We'll have photo ops at the Trade Mart and Walker shooting site. The afternoon tour will feature Dealey Plaza and Oswald's escape route from downtown. Dinner on your own tonight, followed by informal chatting in the hospitality room.

Saturday, April 15 The final tour session in the morning will feature the Tippit murder site, all the known Oswald sites in Oak Cliff including the West Neely Street address where Oswald's "backyard photographs" were taken by Marina, and conclude at his murder site in the Dallas jail basement where we'll meet retired Dallas Police Detective Jim Leavelle, to whom Oswald was handcuffed when shot by Jack Ruby. The afternoon symposium will feature an address by Josiah Thompson, author of the acclaimed *Six Seconds in Dallas*, entitled "The Warren Commission and the Single Bullet Theory: A Revisionist Account," and an interview of Buell Wesley Frazier by Dave Perry. Frazier drove Oswald to work on November 22, 1963. The farewell dinner in Reunion Tower, fifty stories above Dealey Plaza, will be followed by a panel discussion with the experts and witnesses.

Sunday, April 16 Depart at your leisure following breakfast.
