**Malcolm Kilduff** served as Assistant Press Secretary to President Kennedy and President Johnson. He was in Dallas on November 22, 1963 and made the official announcement of the president's death.

**Darwin Payne** is a noted Dallas historian. In 1963 he was a reporter for the *Dallas Times Herald* and was the first reporter to interview Abraham Zapruder regarding his dramatic film.

**Judge Barefoot Sanders** was U.S. Attorney in Dallas in 1963. He met Air Force One at Love Field and served a key role in organizing the impromptu inauguration of President Johnson.

*JFK: The Torch is Passed* is a new documentary jointly produced by The Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza and KDFW/Fox 4.

Drawing upon the archives of The Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza, the special focuses on the time between the assassination and the swearing in of President Johnson. Those two hours in Dallas are some of the most dramatic in our country's history. The fear of Communist plotting, the desire to get the new president out of Dallas, and the drama of the violent death of a young leader make for extraordinary history.

The documentary includes both news footage and newly discovered, unique color footage by amateur photographers. Additionally, we were able to draw upon the Museum's extensive Oral History collection.

The documentary, *JFK: The Dallas Tapes*, which premiered at our 1998 Legacy event, recently received the Heartland Emmy Award for Best Historic Documentary. It is available on our website at [jfk.org](http://jfk.org).

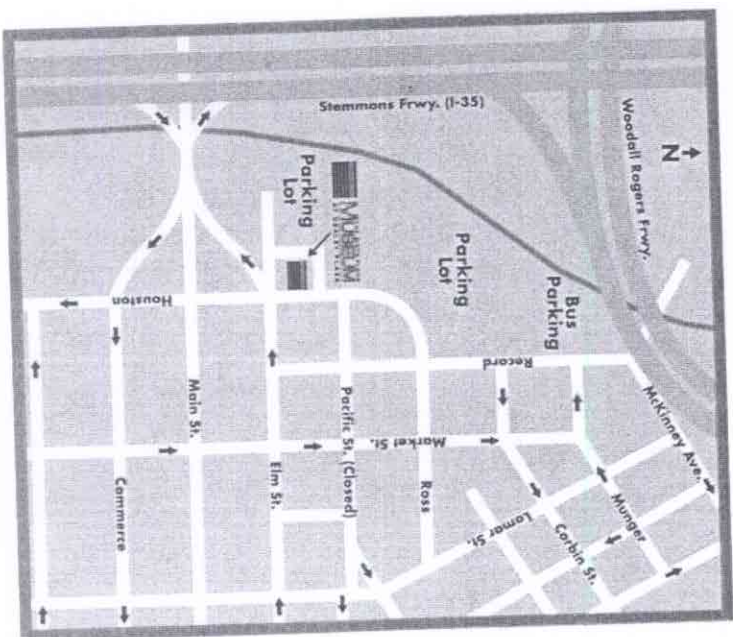
THE SIXTH FLOOR MUSEUM AT DEALLEY PLAZA chronicles the assassination and legacy of President John F. Kennedy; preserves the Dealey Plaza National Historic Landmark District and the Kennedy Memorial; and provides audiences with the tools to navigate contemporary culture within the context of presidential history.

The Museum is located on the sixth floor of the former Texas School Book Depository building in downtown Dallas, Texas. Nearly 400 historic photographs, original interviews, artifacts, interpretive displays, and award-winning films take the Museum visitor back to the 1960s and through one of the most vividly remembered events of this century. More than 450,000 visitors tour the Museum each year.
