

Tina Towner Barnes

In 1963 Tina Towner was a typical thirteen-year-old. When her father, James M. Towner learned of the impending visit of President Kennedy, he asked his wife and youngest daughter, Tina, if they would like to go downtown to see the President and First Lady. Both Mr. Towner's still photographs and Tina's film were used by *Life* magazine in November 1967 for an article on amateur photographers of the assassination. The Towner family was not questioned, nor were their pictures examined, during the Warren Commission investigation.

Malcolm Couch

Malcolm Couch was a reporter/photographer for WFAA television in November of 1963. Assigned to cover President Kennedy's motorcade, Couch's car was in front of the Dallas County Criminal Courts building when the first shot rang out. The 22 1/2 seconds of film made by Couch of the scene along Elm Street is one of only two films made from the motorcade at the time of the shooting.

Orville Nix, Jr.

Although Orville Nix, Jr. did not witness President Kennedy's assassination, he knows the story very well. His late father, Orville Nix, Sr., was a native Texan and employee of the General Services Administration and was in Dealey Plaza on November 22, 1963. He captured part of the assassination on his Keystone Auto-Zoom K-18 camera. Mr. Nix, Jr. assisted his father in the sale of the film to UPI. The film was later used by the FBI in its investigation.

Patsy Paschall

Patsy Paschall worked as a court clerk in the Dallas County Courthouse at the corner of Main and Houston Streets in 1963. She was excited about the presidential visit and was particularly interested in seeing Mrs. Kennedy. Her film, taken from a unique vantage point from Old Red, was borrowed by the FBI for its investigation of the assassination and was used by *Life* Magazine in its November 1967 issue on assassination related photos taken by amateurs.

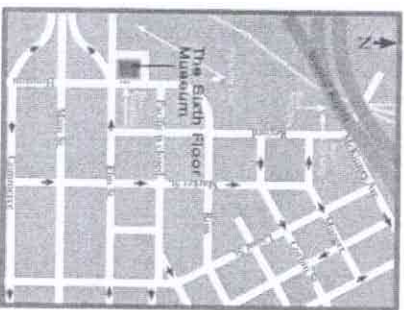

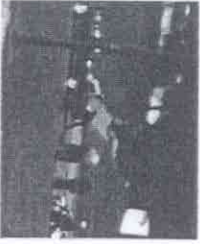
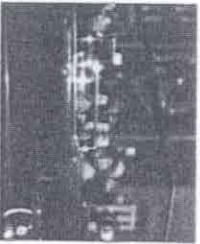
