Theater where assassin was arrested to reopen

The Dallas theater where police captured presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald is set to reopen Friday. It closed three years ago for lack of business. This time, the theater will showcase its historic connection. Oswald's name and the infamous date — Nov. 22, 1963 — are painted in white block letters on the seat where he took in a matinee after killing President John F. Kennedy. Glass cases in the lobby contain newspaper headlines about the arrest and other artifacts. The 550-seat theater, which opened in 1931 and was once owned by Howard Hughes, plans to show second-run films for \$2 a person.

Rose Kennedy on the mend: Rose Kennedy, 104, the matriarch of the Kennedy family, was reported feeling better yesterday, two days after she had trouble breathing. "Mrs. Kennedy's condition is improved and her family feels there is no cause for immediate concern," said Pamela Hughes, spokeswoman for Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass.
