Dear Athan,

I was making a copy of 62-109060-4114 for my lawyer's use if there is a remand in my field offices FOIA case because it reflects the fact that in even the JFK assassination investigation/case, with the enormous accumulation of records at FBIHQ, it knew that Dallas might have information on the critics that it did not have at FBIHQ. And this relating to the first two of the major books, before Epstein's was published.

It also appeared possible that like me, you may not recall any prior record referring to "the Director's special."

The actual author is probably Kenneth M. Raupach, who I think worked for Alex Rosen in GID. I think it is Kenneth but I'm not now sure.

I find it quite surprising that there is this indication that Dallas had info on me at that early date, indicated by this language after a phone call from FBIHQ to it, but then my book had come out two weeks earlier. Or, rather, that was its release date, when I provided copies to the press.

The date is a holiday and as I recall the date of publication in the Post, Memorial Day.

So, before real attention to the works critical of the Warren Commission, there was this "cover" special. That is, if I may conjecture, rather a JFK assassination "special" request he'd made.
