Last night I referred you to Mr. Sullivan's book and what it says about the DeLoach operation, its control for the FBI and public relations and its importance to the FBI. Earlier I filed appeals relating to an irrational engineer, George Thomson, of Pasadena, Calif. The FBI has refused to search the DeLoach/"Crime Records" files in compliance with my requests, particularly not in response to the other writers item of the King assassination requests.

This morning, at the top of the stack of accumulated copies, there is attached ~~Not~~ Recorded from 65-109059, Section 99. (The identification is illegible on the record so I've added it.)

Walter Mitchell sent however some of Thomson's notices. The routing to the top brass, the assistant directors, is extensive. Even the Inspector General was included.

This brief memo, prepared for the Director, states that "Crime Records Division maintains a chronic card of George G. Thomson." Certainly a matter of moment in the crime investigations of the FBI.

However, this indicates that this Division maintained its own records outside of Central Records and that it had its own indices, which is what a "chronic card" is.

The invisible identification of the file in which the original was placed cannot be the assassination file because this copy is from that file. This also indicates that assassination records are kept in other files, other files not searched.

This also raises questions about the existence of indices of those classified as other than "chronic," people like me.

There is arbitrary, inconsistent and irrational withholding relating to Thomson in this Section or one near it. Despite extensive disclosures about him, including his letterhead, his name is omitted from his letterhead - to protect his privacy."
