Kerry Thornley was a former associate of Lee Harvey Oswald at a Marine base near El Toro, California, during the approximate period April, 1959, to June, 1959. During that period, Thornley was in frequent contact with Oswald, but did not associate with him off the base nor was he a close friend of Oswald. Following Thornley's discharge from the Marine Corps, Thornley worked as a doorman and waiter, and wrote a book entitled, "The idle Warriors," based upon his experiences in the Marine Corps. He was unable to obtain a publisher for the book. However, following the assassination Thornley decided the main character in his book closely resembled Oswald in philosophy and actions and is now trying to interest publishers in / the book. In the current book entitled, "Oswald," Thornley uses several chapters from "The Idle Warriors" in an effort to embellish his knowledge : of and his association with Oswald. In his current book entitled, "Oswald," Thornley docs not produce any facts concerning Oswald that were not brought out during our investigation of Oswald. Much of his effort is spent in psycho-2 analyzing Oswald and speculating as to Oswald's motives for the assassination and his plans for the future had he escaped. Thornley is of the Å opinion Oswald had a desire for power and that failing to achieve his objective either in the United States or in Russia, sought fame through 141 killing President Kennedy. Thornley feels that Oswald would never have confessed to the crime, but would have maintained he was innocent to the ٠. very end. The final chapter of Thornley's book is merely a report of his testimony before the Warren Commission.
