FBI probes Ford, Rocky threats

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Secret Service is investigating threats to kill President Ford and Vice President Rockefeller in Dallas, Tex., and New York City, a spokesamn said Friday.

"We're aware of threats in New York and a threat in Dallas and we're investigating," said the spokesman, Ken-Lynch. He declined to give further details.

In Dallas, an anonymous telephone caller told The Associated Press a plot was conceived against Ford and Rockefeller primarily as the outgrowth of the police slaying Monday night of a Bishop College student from Nigeria.

In New York, threats to kill Ford and

Rockefeller and to blow up buildings were made in telephone calls Tuesday to the New York Daily News and ABC News, said a spokesman for the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

In addition to the President and vice president, the caller in New York threatened to kill FBI Director Clarence Kelley and Atty. Gen. Edward H. Levi, the FBI spokesman said.

The spokesman said the caller was a male. "The guy said he was with the Weather Underground," the spokesman added. The Weather Underground claimed responsibility for a bombing at the State Department last Jan. 29. There were no injuries in that explosion.

The caller who telephoned The AP in Dallas said a group of 20 to 25 persons is involved in a plot to kill Ford and Rockefeller when they appear before the National Republican Woman's convention.
