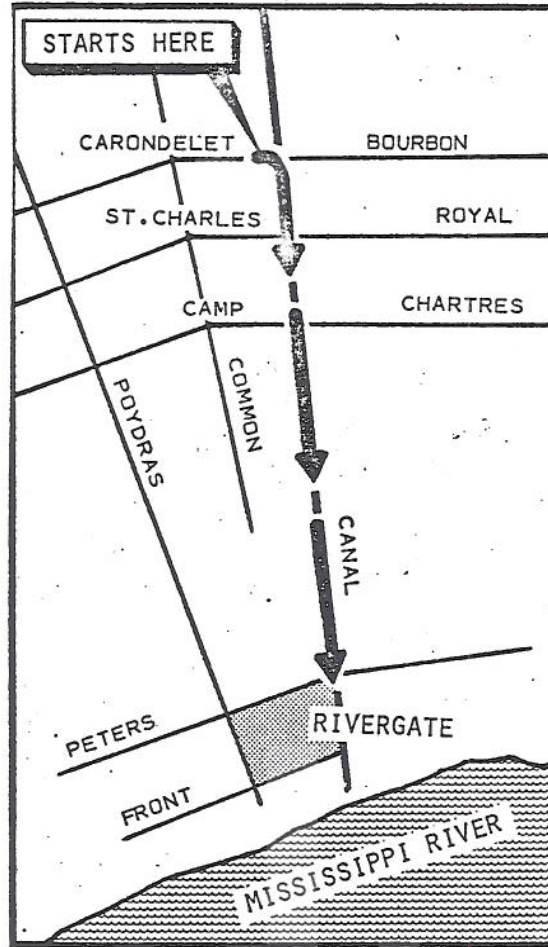


VFW'S AUXILIARY TO GIVE 'PEACE AWARD' TO NIXON

President to Arrive in
N.O. at 10:30 A.M.

WASHINGTON, D.C. —

President Richard Nixon—who brought about the cease-fire in Vietnam, re-established relations with China after a quarter of a century of silence and created a better understanding with Soviet Russia after 20 years of Cold War—is going to receive the Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary's "Peace Award" in New Orleans Monday.

The White House said Sunday night President and Mrs. Nixon will arrive at New Orleans International Airport about 10:30 a.m. and moments later will proceed in a motorcade to downtown New Orleans. The presidential motorcade is scheduled to arrive downtown about 11 a.m.

Starting at the intersection of Carondelet and Canal streets, the motorcade will proceed on to The Rivergate, where the President will deliver a foreign policy address at the opening session of the 74th Annual Convention of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

The presidential party will be greeted at the airport by Gov. Edwin W. Edwards and his wife; Mayor Moon Landrieu and members of the Louisiana congressional delegation.

Gov. Edwards will present the President a pair of cuff links. Mrs. Edwards will present flowers to Mrs. Nixon.
