space* Two days later the Strategic Air Command (SAC) jumped to full -war footing for the first time ever - meaning that 550 nuclear-bo<sup>m</sup> carrying B-52s took to the air. Kennedy, McNamara and the JCS did not know that Gen. Thomas Powers of SAC, without authorization, issued the order "in the clear" instead of in code, enabling the ~~startled~~ Soviets to intercept the message. This excessive flaunting of U.S. strategic superiority confirmed the president's and Mc Namara's fears that the military might precipitate a war (page 203).

It certainly gave the Soviets reason to believe that we were about to drop those nuclear bombs on them and that others would be launched. In turn, that gave them reason to wonder whether they should try for a nuclear first-strike.

And that would have incinerated the world.
