Anti-Reds Plan Speeches

More than 1,000 registered delegates are expected to attend sessions of the sixth annual Christian Crusade national convention in Dallas Friday through Sunday.

Some of the country's most outstanding anti-Communist speakers will address delegates from 23 states. Resolutions passed by the delegates will be sent to President Johnson at the close of the meeting.

Frank Kluckhohn, former correspondent for the New York Times and author of "America, Listen," will be keynote speaker at a banquet Saturday in the Baker Hotel.

T. Coleman Andrews, head of the Internal Revenue Service under President Eisenhower, will speak at the first session Friday night.

Other speakers during the

seven week end sessions include John Stormer, author of "None Dare Call It Treason"; Dr. Billy James Hargis, founder-director of Christian Crusade; Bryton Barron, formerly with the State Department's treaty division, and Robert Welch, founder of the John Birch Society.

Other speakers will be George Shannon, editor of the Shreveport, La., Journal; Maj. Pedro Diaz Lanz, former head of Fidel Castro's Cuban army force and Gen. Edwin A. Walker, former combat officer forced into retirement because of his vigorous opposition to communism.
