

CASTRO WARNS U.S. NOT TO LAND IN CUBA

HAVANA, May 18—Premier Fidel Castro warned the United States again today against a military "adventure" on Cuban soil.

If United States soldiers were to land on this island as they have done in Santo Domingo, the Cuban leader exclaimed, "they would re-embark the same day!"

Premier Castro praised the Dominican rebels for what he termed their heroism in the face of United States power and predicted further upheaval in the Western Hemisphere.

The Premier, who is also commander in chief of the Cuban armed forces, was addressing 450 graduates of a course for future officers in the Army Academy of Matanzas, east of Havana.

His unexpected two-hour speech was relayed over a nationwide radio and television hook-up.
