The United States Government yesterday blacklisted
eight more foreign-flag ships
for trading with Cuba

The vessels now are ineligible to carry United States Government-financed cargoes from the United States. A total of 235 ships are on the list, which was begun Jan. 1, 1963.

Ships added to the list yesterday were the British ships Free Merchant, Newdene, Sea Empress and Soclyve, the Lebanese ships Al Amin and Nictric, the French ship Mungo and the Moroccan ship Marrakech.
