Britain to Aid Castro Farming

GLASGOW, (UPI)—A British agricultural scientist will go to Cuba next year to set up a research center aimed at improving dairy cattle production on the Communist island.

Dr. Reginald Preston, principal scientific officer at the Rowett Institute, Aberdeenshire, said Cuban Premier Fidel Castro has engaged him to boost agricultural research in the country.

He will head a special institute, built to his own specifications, on an estate 40 miles from Havana. His staff will consist of about 20 handpicked agricultural scientists from Europe and Australia.
