

Frei Wants Cuba Back In Family

PARIS, July 6 — President Eduardo Frei of Chile has urged that Cuba be "reintegrated in the American family," the French newspaper Le Monde reported today.

In an interview published on the eve of his arrival in Paris on a four-day official visit, Le Monde quoted the Chilean leader as saying:

"We wish to see Cuba reintegrated in the American family. Cuba belongs to this family by indestructible links.

"As far as we are concerned," he added, "we are resolute supporters of the principle of self-determination. We consider that every people has the right to choose its own government."

Frei, who was received in audience by Pope Paul VI at the Vatican today, also warned against the setting up of a permanent inter-American armed force.

A proposal to establish such a force was submitted by Brazil to the Organization of American States (OAS) shortly after the dispatch of U. S. troops to the Dominican Republic in April. It is expected to come up for discussion at an inter-American foreign ministers' conference in Rio de Janeiro next month.

The Chilean President said: "From my own point of view, what is needed to fight against the danger of penetration of anti-democratic ideologies is to tackle the very cause of this penetration, namely poverty, illiteracy, the absence of the masses from power and a fairer distribution of wealth."
