Cuban Exile Units Vote to Coordinate

MIAMI, Fla., May 30 (AP) Delegates of 55 Cuban exile organizations voted early today to form a central body to coordinate anti-Castro activity.

The council, called the Cuban Assembly, is to begin functioning after the selection of a president and secretary next week. New officers will be selected every two weeks by lottery.

The organizational meeting was called by Brazilian Congressman Everardo Magalhaes who has been conferring with exile leaders for a week.

"Unless you unite," he told exiles, "nobody would know to which of you to send arms." Magalhaes said he will tour Latin America to drum up interest in the exile's cause.
