

MIAMI, Fla. (A)—Havana Radio said Friday night that the Cuban armed forces shot down a "pirate" airplane that bombed a sugar mill.

The broadcast said the plane dropped three bombs on the Marcelo Salado mill near Caibarien in Las Villas Province.

One of the bombs exploded at the mill but there were no casualties, it said.

The broadcast, monitored in Miami, charged that the plane flew to Cuba from the United States and said the U. S. government was doing nothing to prevent such attacks.

Cuban exiles in Miami have been talking for weeks about a war of sabotage and nerves. But the only action they have announced was a raid on a sugar mill on the south coast of Cuba.
