Cubans Kill Visitor's Wife, Son?

An American whose Cuban-born wife and son were reportedly executed by a Castro firing squad arrived in Oklahoma City Wednesday for a week's visit.

Capt. Robert W. Cales, who says he has made over 200 trips into Cuba carrying supplies and ammunition, describes himself as a supporter of "the Batista faction."

The former anti-Communist dictator now has many friends inside Cuba, Cales says, and is more highly regarded in Florida than he was before Castro came out in the open as a Communist. Supplies 'Dumped'

Cales says he operates his seagoing delivery service "from outside U.S. territorial waters, to avoid our own coast guard." He would like to see the tight restrictions clamped on exile counterrevolutionary activities early in 1963 relaxed — "the sooner the better!"

"Most Americans do not

realize, unless they live in Florida, that shipments of arms, ammunition, and supplies seized in Miami have been taken out into the bay and dumped by our own officials," Cales says.

He says he transferred registry of one of his own four boats to a Central American country to escape U.S. restrictions against landings on the Cuban coast.

Deaths 'Accepted'

The rough-spoken skipper formerly operated fishing and pleasure boats from the Havana area. He says his Cuban wife and their son were arrested and charged with acting as couriers for the underground, and that he has reason to believe the report they were shot by a firing squad is true.

"I have accepted the fact of their deaths," he says. "That is why I must go on fighting until the last remnant of the inhuman Castro regime is gone from Cuba."
