Many Willing To Fight U.S., Castro Says

HAVANA, Dec. 3 (AP) Castro said today that many Cubans would be willing to fight against the United States in Vietnam.

"There are many in this country who would gladly enlist to fight there against the criminal soldiers of Yankee imperialism," Castro said. "The day volunteers are asked, there will be thousands—millions from all parts of the world."

But the speech to a teachers' graduating class seemed no more an indication that he intends to send men to Vietnam than similar previous declarations.

Castro also said that Ernesto Che Guevara "is alive and well," but he shed no new light on the disappearance of the former Minister of Industries.

"Our enemies have gotten the idea that he is dead," Castro said. "For the frustration of our enemies, we can say with infinite satisfaction that he is alive."
