**American Held
In Cuba Says He
Was Well-Treated**

HOLLYWOOD, Fla., March 1 (AP)—Trevor Burns, 43, a Syracuse, N.Y., salesman who had to ditch his plane in the Caribbean two weeks ago and had been in Cuba ever since, returned to the United States today and said he was "treated swell all the way."

His Cuban doctor, Fidel Castro's personal physician, even sent a box of the finest Cuban cigars as a gift to Gov. Nelson Rockefeller. Burns said the doctor expects Rockefeller to be elected President.

Burns, who spent 28 hours in the water—dodging sharks most of the time, he said—was rescued by the Cuban navy, treated at Las Villas Province hospital and later taken to Havana, Feb. 16. There, he was put up in the Havana Hilton, now the Habana Libre, and given "top notch" medical care by Dr. Jose Marquez, Castro's doctor, until he was ready to travel. He was flown to the United States by a friend.
