U.S. Adds 4 Vessels To Blacklist on Cuba

WASHINGTON, Jan. 31 (AP)—The Maritime Admin-istration added four ships today to its blacklist of vessels that have called at Cuban ports since Jan. 1, 1963, raising the total to 206.

Two of the newly added vessels, the Changpaishan and the Chiang Kiang, fly the British flag. The others are the Anka, which flies the flag of Cyprus, and the Bar, which flies the Yugoslav flag. Placement of a ship on the blacklist bars it from carrying cargoes financed by the United States Government,

United States Government, such as foreign aid and sur-

such as foreign aid and surplus food shipments.

Ships now on the list fly the flags of these countries: Britain 59, Cyprus 30, Lebanon 23, Greece 16, Poland 20, Italy 12, Finland 8, Panama 8, France 7, Yugoslavia 8, Malta 4, Morocco 4, the Netherlands 2, Pakistan 2, Guinea 1 and Somali 2.
