Defiant Tourists Criticize U.S.

MIAMI, June 28. (UPI)—A group of 75 Americans who came to Cuba in defiance of the U. S. Government has issued a statement denouncing U. S. "intervention" in South Viet-Nam, Radio Havana said today.

The statement, according to the broadcast monitored in Miami, called on Washington "to recognize the right of the South Vietnamese people to determine their own destiny."

The Americans, many of whom describe themselves as students, also demanded that the United States "recognize and respect the 1954 Geneva agreements and stop the South Viet-Nam war, which they describe as the most brutal and criminal in history," the Castro Radio said.
