CIA 'deleted' in Warren report

FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT WASHINGTON, Nov. 3

Mr. Harold Weisberg, author of a number of books on the Kennedy assassination, said today that a reference to the Central Intelligence Agency was deleted from the Warren Commission's report.

He said he had evidence of a number of deletions, including the F.B.I.'s refusal to investigate alleged connexions between the agency and Lee Harvey Oswald.

There is no suggestion of implicating the C.I.A. in any alleged conspiracy, but only that Oswald or some of the Cubans he knew had had connexions with the agency. Mr. Weisberg claims he has evidence that the Warren Commission was aware of these connexions and chose not to publish them.
