Statements by Weisberg Are Refuted

Carlos Bringuier, a Cuban refugee living in New Orleans, Monday denied statements made in an article published in The Times-Picayune Saturday, pertaining to his suit against author Harold Weisberg, Canyon Books, Canyon Distributing Co., Dell Publishing Co. and Gambi Publishing Co.

Canyon published Weisberg's book, "Oswald in New Orleans -Case for Conspiracy with the C.I.A." Bringuier was awarded \$5,000 by Civil District Court Judge David Gertler. In the article published Sat-

urday, Weisberg stated that n Bringuier's counsel did not at- A - tempt to serve him with a sub-

pena, and in fact, that they knew that Weisberg was in New Orleans. Also, Weisberg stated he was not a party to the suit. although his name was used in the suit against Canyon.

"This attempt by Mr. Weisg berg to discredit my lawyers," said Bringuier, "shows once again who tells the truth and it who distorts it, because after initiating this suit in Civil Disit trict Court, we have never bknown of Weisberg having been le in New Orleans, in which case we could have served him and 0would have been able to have, at last, the opportunity to conal front him under oath."

r-Bringuier also stated that the suit filed in the Civil District Court clearly demonstrates that Weisberg is a party to the suit, 1n a named defendent, which cona-tradicts Weisberg's Saturday in statement.

Bringuier also said that it ₩. ig should not be the intention of Weisberg "to have this case tried in the newspapers but in 1'e k the courts of Louisiana, which n ie is the only forum able to clarify whether or not Weisberg is er 's guilty" of having libeled Brint. guier. n-
