

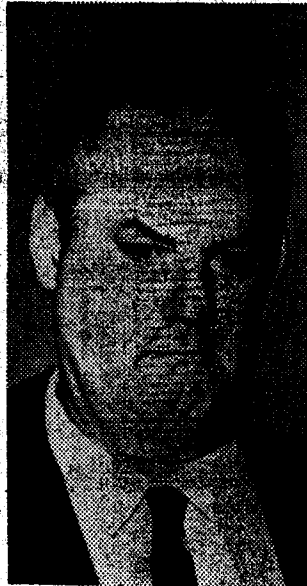

Ruby Lawyer Tax Indictment Is Revealed

AUSTIN, Tex. (AP)—A federal grand jury indictment unsealed in open court today accused Jasper, Tex., lawyer Joe Tonahill, one of the lawyers in the Jack Ruby murder trial, of evading \$125,732 in income taxes.

Tonahill pleaded innocent before U.S. District Judge Jack Roberts.

The three-count indictment was returned last April 14 and then sealed by agreement of

both the government and defense attorneys, Roberts said.

The judge said the indictment was unsealed today "because the interests of the parties and of justice will be served by the unsealing."

Tonahill was one of the lawyers defending Ruby against the charge of murdering Lee Harvey Oswald, identified by the Warren Commission as the assassin of President John F. Kennedy.

Ruby was sentenced to death in the electric chair, but died of cancer last January while awaiting a new trial after his conviction was reversed and a second trial ordered.
