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### BOMB CANNISTER DECLARED DUD

#### Ordnance Experts Take Charge of Device

A three-foot bomb casing found on a rubbish heap at Florida and Canonge Wednesday afternoon was declared a dud by ordnance experts who took charge of the rusting de-

vice. Capt. Allen Heffker, Fifth Police District commander, said ordnance men from Alvin T. Under Field in Belle Chasse took the cannister into their possession at 4 p. m., shortly after finding that it contained no explosives.

The shell was taken to the Municipal Air Station. A Sewerage and Water Board worker, Anthony Wiebelt, 45, 4835 Lancelot, found the casing about 12:45 p. m. and notified police. It lay in a weeded area about two blocks from any residences.

Police emergency unit personnel kept the shell in a special container for explosives until the Navy men arrived.

The shell apparently was a discarded souvenir. Ordnance men found a spot where someone apparently tried to weld something to it, possibly for decorative purposes.
