On Monday, July 17, 1967 I had an appointment with Dr. Marie Stanberry for an eye examination. Knowing that I work for you, she commented that you had done a very good job of rebuttal on the previous Saturday night on television. She said it was obvious to her, and to many other people, what the news media was trying to do.

During our conversation (which was quite one-sided) she told me about one of her patients from Hammond, Louisiana, who had been in about 2 weeks ago. He had told Dr. Stanberry that there were at least 12 caches of arms around Hammond which had been put there by the C.I.A. He said it was common knowledge around that area.

Dr. Stanberry also remarked that it was amazing that no one outside of the City of New Orleans knows that Clay Shaw is a homosexual. She said that for years her husband had an office in the International Trade Mart and that he had told her Clay Shaw was viciously contrary with all of his employees. She also told me about her husband relating to her what he had heard about an acquaintance paying very large sums of money in blackmail. Inasmuch as Dr. Stanberry had been talking about Clay Shaw, I got the distinct impression this money had been paid to him.

When my new lens are ready, I have to have them checked by Dr. Stanberry. If you wish, I will ask her about the blackmail in more detail. I didn't want to pursue it too much at the time.
