## Salvage Play About Oswald As a TV Film

The continued discussion and questioning on various TV programs about the truth behind the assassination of President Kennedy has resulted in one independent TV producer's coming up with a new angle to exploit the trend. Charles Fries Productions is preparing "The Trial of Lee Harvey Oswald," a TV movie for ABC.

The property itself is not new, having laid dormant for eight years. Originally a play, "The Trial of Lee Harvey Oswald" opened at the ANTA Theater here in 1967.

Fries bought TV rights to the play from its authors, Amram Ducovny and Leon Friedman. In writing their play, the authors assumed that Jack Ruby's shot did not kill Oswald, two days after the Kennedy assassination, and now Oswald is on trial for his alleged killing of the President.

Saul Levitt, author of "The Andersonville Trial," is writing the TV movie script for "The Trial of Lee Harvey Oswald." Lawrence Schiller and Richard Freed will be the co-producers and Fries the executive producer.
