Marina Oswald Porter, widow of President Kennedy's assassin, fell asleep watching the first part of "The Trial of Lee Harvey Oswald," ABC-TV's movie-length speculation on what might have happened if Oswald had not been killed by Jack Ruby two days after the Nov. 22, 1963, assassination in Dallas. "I watched part of it, but I fell asleep," Porter told the Dallas Times Her-

ald. "I worked all day and I was just tired." The widow, who said she has always believed Oswald was guilty and was not upset at the movie's portrayal of him as a madman, said what she did see "was pretty close to the truth." She has a book coming out in a few weeks.
