I'll read the magazine as I can, in between other things. I wish a glance at it persuaded it contains anything new.

There is little point in sending things from New York by air, for~~at~~ mail changes at Baltimore or Harrisburg, and the little that might be save by air that far is lost in the shuffle.

We had a pleasant visit with Russ. He is a fine young man of whom I am fond. And he has been helpful.

Unfortunately, the kinds of people who associate with the Ferriss in this world are not the most probative, never pillars of society, so it is inevitable they sometimes come through as less than the most dependable. This is one of Garrison's troubles. I heard of Spiessel the night we met in New York and did not then think he would survive ~~cross~~ examination.

The other things I recall saying that night I still believe applicable today.

I think there is a chance there will be an acquittal. However, the blow to the official fiction will be a very heavy one.

man killed President Kennedy. I learned that many of these people listen to Walter Keenan on Station WOR and believe as he does that an outside agency - such as Scotland Yards - should have investigated the Assassination of John Kennedy.
