RE: INVESTIGATION.

On June 27, 1967 STEVE BERKEWITZ, an editor on the University of Michigan paper at Ann Arbor, called to advise that there was an ALEXANDER ORLOV employed by the University. ORLOV is a former Soviet Security Officer who defected to the United States and wrote a handbook on guerilla warfare. The purpose of BERKEWITZ's call was to determine if ORLOV could be identical with the COLONEL ORLOV mentioned in the Warren Report as calling on MARENA OSWALD with GEORGE DEMOHRENSCHILDT.

BERKEWITZ mentioned, and this is the interesting point, that MARENA had been sent to the English Language Institute at Ann Arbor to learn English. He claimed the E.L.I. is run by a former British Intel-type first name IAN. He says that the E.L.I. operates the Southeast Asia Regional English Project which is supposedly sponsored by the United States Office of Missions, A.I.D. This is very probably a C.I.A. operation.
