Turner, as Turner may be a witness at Shaw's Turner is the celf-centered, embittered pending trial. individual who has made frequent scurrilous attacks upon the Director and the Bureau since his dismissal from the FBI. In recent weeks Turner has been closely associated with_ New Crienas District Attorney James C. Garrison. The attorney, Edward F. Wegmann of New Orleans, advised the case of Louislans vs. Shaw will be tried on or about the case February 13, 1963. Regmann inquired whether Turner resigned from the FPI or was discharged and whether he ever was a member ? of the White House Secret Service Detail. Ur. Vinson speculates that if Turner appears as a witness he may be used in an attempt to discredit the Kennedy assassination investigation conducted ... by the PBI and other Government agencies. Ordinarily, in answering on inquiry from a non-Federal Government source concerning a former employee, we supply minimum information, including dates of employment, position, with y and, if appropriate, that his services were terminated. Within the past year we have had two inquiries from Federal Government sources concerning Turner and we have enswered them in much walkers greater detail than usual. One was from the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) in March, 1967, after a "Ramparts" magazine articlo had appeared concerning CIA subsidizing of various fronts or foundations. Turner, a member of the "Ramparts" magazine staff, had called at the Asia Foundation in San Francisco attempting to secure information concerning the source of the Foundation's funds, and CIA then filed a service record inquiry with us 300 concorning him. Agency made a service record inquiry. These two inquiries wore answered much mero fully than usual, as indicated above.

Though the current inquirer, Attorney Tegmann, is in no sense a Federal Government a oncy, his inquiry has been tremitted to us through the Proartment. Because of this and because of the unique nature of this particular inquiry, it is felt we should furnish a concil memorandum to the Department setting forth brief facts as to Turner's FBI employment and dismissal and his efforts to obtain reinstatement in the FBI. This information has been prepared by the Administrative Division in this particular matter. It is felt that in furnishing this information to the Department, we should point out to the Department that it must be the Department's decision as to whether any or all of this Information concerning-Turner should be given to Mr. Wegmann.

Our files contain no information indicating whether Turner was ever a member of the White House Secret Service Detail. This information could be obtained by the Department through a check with the Secret Service or by the Department referring Mr. Negmann to the Secret Service.

ACTION

Attached for approval is a letter to Assistant
Attorney General Vinson transmitting to him a concise summary
of Turner's employment, dismissal and efforts to obtain
reinstatement in the FRI. We are informing Ur. Vinson that
it must be the Department's decision as to whether any or all
