TTne events of the past tro years, the editorial says, have demonstrated that the program of actipr. adopted by the Fisth World Congress of Irade prions convened at Wriv s initiative gave a correct orientation to the finternational movenent of the working class. The morld, since that cohgress, hes witnessed the stzengthening of positions of the progressive forces and of the workime class and the trade tnion movement adhering to class and internationelist positions.
Great and important tasks face the 4 FIU at the present stage, the paper writes. The first and foremost task is to support actively the struggle of all progressive forces to avert a Horld thermonuclear war. Wrying to stem the victorfous advance of the ideas of peace and progress, reactionary imperialist circtes are ready to plunge into any adventures. The progressive forces are in a fosition and dutybound to thwart the arms race and war preparations, to ckmel the imperialists to recognize the principle of peaceinl coexistence, and to accept an agreement on general disarmament. To stare out the focel points of the war anger, the paper writes, it is essential to eliminate the remnants of World Wer II in Europe. The abnormal situation in West Berlin and the revanchist aspirations of definite circles in West Eernsny constitute a serious áanger to world peace. The working people will intensify their struggle eimed at terminating the agzression of the American imperialists against the peopie of South Wetnam, agoinst thefr crimes in South Korea, against the bloody reprisels by British autiorities in Aden, against imperialist intervention in the Internal afrests of Cyprus and Pannma, and in support of the national Iiberation struggle of all the oppressed peoples.

(Se:t) New York--The preliminary hearing into the cass of ristint ciub INOprietion Jack Fuby, mumderer of I. Oswald, has endec in Dallas. During t tio-dey session, the experienced lawyers defenting tire gangster fioc "put sway" Lee Obwald, tie American who hed been charged with the zurder of President Kennedy, tried to have their client released on bail. A certain "lawyer of his acquaintance" was prepared to put up 100,000 dollars.

Fovever, defense counsels withorew their petition after tine court ruled tist an "impartial clinical examination" of the zantal and physical conbition of the munderer should be carried out. Soecielists are to test Ruioy ${ }^{i}$ b nervous system, take X-rays, and, with the aid of a special epparatus, measure the (words indistinct) of the gangster's brein.

The renerable lawyers who represent Ruby are basing their defense on two Zines. On the one hand, they are trying to prove that Ruby is an "ercient etriott who wes so shocked by Kennedy ${ }^{1}$ s assassination thet he deciaed to evenge the President's death. On the other hand, they are seeking to zove that their client is hals-mad--a man "with serious organic defects of the brein" who mudered 0s:nld in a state of temporary insenity. Fuby's ow behavior tallies with these two lines of argument. Sametimes he utters unintellisicle cries and other times he tells corresponients: "I cennot understand how we could have lost such a great man," meaning the assessination of President Kennedy.

We must say for the recora's sake that this is by fer not the most caustic comint in the West on the CIA's study of Russian affairs. What is inge tant is not of course the contribution that the CIA has made ts he theseurus of humor. The important thing is that even the rightNerf press in the West has Ilared up, so to say, against these anti-Soviet
