I just talked to our Legal Attache, Clark Anderson, in Mexico City. He advised me as follows:

Gilberto Alvarado Ugarie in Mexico City from Nicaragua has confessed to the Mexican officials that his statement on Oswald was false. This was a statement to the effect that he saw Oswald at the Cuban Consulate in Mexico City on September 18, 1963, and that Oswald had been hired to kill, presumably President Kennedy and was given at that time \$6500 for the job.

Alvarado stated his motive was personal and did not involve his country. He said he wanted to give the U. S. a reason for overcoming Castro.

Our Legal Attache said Ambassador Mann is very pleased at the way the FBI handled the matter and has so advised the Department. Ambassador Mann also wanted his personal gratitude extended to the Director.

SA Lawrence Keenan sent to Mexico from the Seat of Government to handle our aspects of the matter will be returning to Washington, D. C., tomorrow afternoon with full particulars.
