## EX-MARINE ON PROBATION

Thomas A. Vallee, 30, the ex-marine arrested for carrying a hunting knife in his car Nov. 2, the day the late President Kennedy had planned to visit Chicago, was placed under court supervision yesterday and told to report to a probation officer each month for a year.

Vallee, who lives at 1258 Michigan av., was found guilty yesterday on a charge of unlawful possession of a weapon. Judge Cor-

por B. Nash in jury court yesterday withdrew the finding and continued the case for the duration of the supervision.

During the Jan. 13 hearing, police said they were asked by the secret service to watch Vallee while the President was in town. Vallee was known to carry weapons and share extremist political views. Vallee said yesterday he no longer keeps weapons in his car.

He said the disclosures of the affairs of Robert C. [Bobby] Baker, a former secretary of the Senate Democratic majority and a protégé of President Johnson, were bound to be a factor in the campaign.
