Dear Mr. Weisberg--

Well I delayed in writing until I was finished. I talked to my prof's lawyer (I think I told you that) and he gave me Michael D reader's telephone number. Well I called up and the man in charge of the case is Michael D. Eugene. It turns out he has all the papers but he said he can't open his files as the case is not closed yet -- Ray may be able to get another trial. He goes up at the end of this month doesn't he?  
So I think I'll go back at that time or perhaps you should write to

② him. He said you were about 5th on the list as many other people have been asking for the information as well. Also he wasn't familiar with your name so he said he would check with the F.B.I.

I think if Ray is not given another trial it may be possible to obtain the information. He seemed quite reasonable. (Mr. Eugene)

So what do you think? Should I go again (if Ray doesn't get the trial) or should you write a letter or both. Sometimes it's much better to actually go -- less easy to say no. Depending on the trial maybe you should write him a letter saying what exactly you want and your purposes and let me give it to him when I go again. Just an idea. Tell me
