

added that he could have all the big breakfasts he wanted like this, implying that he could have money to pay for them when he needed to. Kessler told this friend that he was to travel shortly and was going to Brazil from the Mexico City times where I presume he was or may still be. I'll have someone check the University register here and see if I can locate his old address in Chicago or his parents and advise you accordingly.

You'll notice that in this Exhibit referring to Kessler the only discrepancy in my report from this friend is that my friend believes it was breakfast the two had whereas this report says the two had dinner. It does not go into other aspects but you'll recall that the other Archive document on Kessler is marked secret, and is unobtainable. I believe this was 956 or 957. In any event it cannot be obtained.

One other thing that I did not mention to you ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ ~~xxxx~~ about this whole episode is what happened to my friend after his conversation with Kessler. Shortly thereafter this friend was asked by the American Friends manager there at the hotel and the desk clerk whose name was Ed Luchels to leave and not stay at the hotel. He was told: "We don't want any trouble around here." This friend also said that he believes his room was searched although he could find nothing missing.

So end for these two exhibits but if there is anything more I can do on them just let me know.

I'm enclosing a pamphlet I have on Cuban Counter-Revolutionary Activities written in March, 1952. It's by Ted Lee on one fair play for Cuba. It's a pamphlet that I had in mind to have printed into print. My friend, in New Orleans, has information as New Orleans can come in very handy at this point. Usage you to do so.

I'm enclosing a copy of the Irving Daily News for March 13, 1957. Refer to my last previous letters on this and you'll see that there was a "Lloyd L. Child" who died in that airplane crash I wrote you about. I'm making a name check across track this one down and see if this is the same Lloyd Child. I hope Garrison can get this one out. I've already half forgotten but haven't heard from him.

Incidentally, I told the Kessler story to ~~xxxx~~ Lane long before the Kessler report was issued and I don't know what use he made of it. It may have passed this on to Garrison.

There are some other items briefly that your attention might be attracted to. I found another reference to Sergio in Jules Rubois' book: "Wiped Out: Rebel-Liberator or Dictator?" Sergio was the son-in-law while in Havana and had a son-in-law working for him by the name of ~~xxxx~~ ~~xxxx~~. Sergio is of course the country because he thought Batista might attack him. (See p. 135, 235 & 245).

The "Lady's Circle" issue of June, 1957 has a story of Mrs. Oswald's interview on WNEW-TV (I have the tape now). She says she knows who killed the President but didn't want to disclose the name. She refers to a man who was a Texan and that she dropped the name before the Commission. If you'll recall I mentioned in a letter to you some time back that Fred Korth had been Mrs. Oswald's divorce lawyer for her then husband. That meant he knew of Oswald long before the assassination. I am Jones had been trying to locate her husband (Lynch) but she had no luck. That makes Korth interesting besides the fact that he was the lawyer who was to all

There are two individuals in that book who are of Irish origin who was in the original planning party of Kennedy's trip. (See Garrison report, p. 26, footnote 27). North may have hired an informant Kennedy one month or so before the assassination. Mrs. Oswald's reference in her book - if I remember correctly - to believe she is related to North. North's name also appears in Oswald's address book.

I had to hear about the CBS-TV special on the Warren report. It'll appear here on the 25, 26, 27. I'll be glad to see Bob Richter and help out in any way I can. Can you tell me more about what East's his view of this whole affair? If he were come on you pass along another phone number for Richter to call if possible should call me during the day when I'm not here. That would be my friend, Sam Sanders, whose house you stayed at when you were in Berkeley. His phone number is: 849-3926. You will relay any messages to me and you might include it in your address book for future use also in case you can't reach me right away.

Regarding your query about Turner's notes on Davis: The last time I spoke to him he said he couldn't recall any specific request from you. I'll be glad to be specific on this matter when I'm off that work and we can talk it over.

I'm sure you'll find the information in the book. The book is a short-ite book. If you have this book:

"....." CIA Director Richard Helms to send to the jury a photograph taken in Mexico during the summer of 1967.

Garrison contends the picture shows accused presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald walking out of the Cuban embassy in Mexico with an unidentified Cuban.

The Cuban, which he alleges, is a powerfully built man whose identification is important to the probe.

The witness scheduled to appear today is Carlos Quiroga, a slight handsome Cuban refugee who belonged to several anti-Castro groups in New Orleans during the early 1960's.

Quiroga was listed as a member of the Cuban Revolutionary Council, headed by Sergio Arcacha Smith, and as chairman for youth of the Friends of Democratic Cuba, of which Arcacha Smith was a leader."

I'm enclosing two articles on our class both of which have reference to you and your work. You can use them as you wish. Lane's point about the book being subsidized coincides with your belief.

Also enclosed you'll find an interesting article on the bullets used in the assassination. It ran in the May, 1967 issue of "Luns" magazine. What's your evaluation of it. The author seems to have relied heavily on your work.

Here is someone you can contact concerning the use of codes in case you're interested in following up on Oswald's address book. In Washington, D.C. there is a code expert (one of the top in the U.S.) by the name of William F. Friedman. He may still have ties with the government, however, and may be reluctant to work on a project such as this. I believe there is more to Oswald's address book than the use of telephone numbers. That is the CIA number that Garrison is talking about in the "front" of his book. It's probable he would be able to help you with this. If you can't get in touch with him, let me know if they can do anything.

I'm sure you'll find a notation in a reproduction of the page from Slay Chew's address book that had Lee Ober's post office box. If you look very carefully in that reproduction an address can be seen typed backwards in which a name ending in "er" appears (____er). Then underneath is an Avenue which looks like _____vedere Ave. (my guess is Belvedere). The rest of the address listing appears to be "Calif" and then a number "78". Since this copy came from Garrison's office I would presume
