Dear Mr. Weisberg,


I am a 20 year veteran in the JFK campaign following a path different from that of the "critics". In a letter to Henry Hurt, I mentioned that I believed I had unusual information about the Tague shot and would like to submit it to you, if you were still interested in wringing out all the information in the Altgens picture. I'll be happy to put together a bundle of information and requirements for you, if you are interested in working out the clues.

Would you care to examine some data revealing how Oswald's(?) 3 cartridges produced over 20 bullets, several corpses, and many wounded? If this is news to you, I can set you on the trail of some fascinating reading. This isn't of my doing. The chap who did the investigating had it on the air in the Los Angeles area for months. The verifiable documentation is worth the knowing.

The holidays and other work has set me back by weeks in getting out this letter. A little time can be regained, if you want to work on the case, by getting a copy of the original Robert West map shown at the top of page 4 in J. Thompson's SIX SECONDS IN DALLAS. A common map is required for reference by those who will work with your data. My preliminary work shows that copying from the book and enlarging incurs paper stretching and mismatching that puts the results in question. Writing to five official addresses in Dallas to get a map revealed that the siege mentality still grips the town. If you can provide me with General E.A. Walker's Dallas address, or have him write me direct, we can recover a great deal of time; He is important in the case and will have to be contacted sooner or later.

I hope you will take an active interest in the case. You are the one who exposed the cropping effects on the Altgens photo; you are the one most qualified to see it to the finish.
