Your copy of "L.B.J. and the J.F.K. Conspiracy" came today with your 4/20/79 note.

I wish I'd known that you want the book returned. I'd have asked you, as I now ask, to please see if another copy is available out there. I'd not heard of it in the east and I'm sure it is not locally available.

While I would want a copy for archival purposes my immediate interest is in the continuing disinformation, particularly by Hugh McDonald.

Robin Moore as ghost makes this more interesting. Not diminished by the incomplete list of his prior books. Omitted is a similar work on Jack Youngblood titled Devil to Pay.

I don't recall having heard of Conder Books, at Westport, Vonn. But the major owner of McDonald's first publisher is a Connecticut man, who had a phony McDonald Publishing Co. front.

I can understand your desire to keep this work and if you cannot replace it out there, for which I'll repay you, I'll return this. But I'm not going to start to read it until I can mark it up because it is hardly worth two readings and I would like to annotate it, especially because I am certain it will draw on some of the assassination mythologies.
