Perhaps you'd like to see some of these records I referred to.

The Katzenbach memo to Moyers was written, from other records I have, as soon as Oswald was killed and they knew there would not be any trial with the evidence subject to cross-examination. Katzenbach had no secretary that Sunday afternoon so he wrote it out in longhand. That and the Department of Justice file copy (File 129-11) are here along with the FBI file copy (62-109060) and the memo of the FBI assistant director who was its liaison with the Department, Courtney Evans. I think it is obvious that before any real investigation was possible it was not possible to conclude that the nonexistent evidence would have led to his conviction.


The handwritten log of LBJ's Sunday 11/24 is from the Secret Service part of those records at the LBJ Library, at Austin.

The CEC on the memo to Russell was his legislative assistant, Charles E. Campbell. I've highlighted the fact that Senator Russell, the most politically conservative of the Commissioners, was its first critic.
