In the past, you have been so kind as to have my friend, Harold Weisberg, on your show to discuss the President Kennedy assassination. As you may recall, Harold is the leading expert on this subject, as well as the murder of Martin Luther King.

I even wrote a National Enquirer article about it that was not published. Perhaps I should save it for my book, but Harold believes these are the property of the American public, so I provide it to you. It has only been published by me.

This memo proves two things. 1. LBJ thought JFK was killed in a plot, not by a lone Lee Harvey Oswald. 2. LBJ suspected the CIA.
