Merk Lane, Loo Sauvage, Harold Welabarg, and renn Jones have ell written books critical of the findings of the Freeldont's Concission and these individuals have been the subject of previous nemorands showing that their theories. observations, and writings in many instances were propered out of context and did not reveal the true picture. for the President; the question of ownership of the assausingtion rifle; the question of the identification of the essessingtion rifle by the Dallas Police Department when it was first found on the sixth floor of the Taxas School Book Depository Building; the eccuracy and the apparity for firing of the researchation rifle; and the validity of various photographs and movies that were obtained and taken during the assassination.

The FBI was mentioned in several instances. For exemple, Crville Mix was one of the bystanders who photographed the motorcade in Dallas and the film he took, plus his camera, was utilized to establish the sequence of events of the assassination at the re-enectment. Lane alleged the "Mix" film was ruined by the FBI and that the camera was also destroyed by the FBI. These ellegations are absolutely false. The cutopay of the Fresident is discussed and mention is made of the report submitted by Eurocu Agents who witnessed the autopay examination performed on the Fresident at Bothesdo Beval Bospital. It is stated that the report propared by our Agents was "a very imprecise document" and "it's a very incomplete Cocument." Our Agents accurately and completely reported the opinions expressed by the attending autopsy physicians.

Fenn Jones, a Texas Hewspaper editor, expounds the theory there is schething sinister in the fact that at least 16 people are now deed who he alleges had some extra knowledge or connection with Lee Harvey Oswald. He suggests that Dorothy Kilgellen's deeth could be part of an over-all plot to kill persons connected with the assessination. Kilgellen was a former newspaper columnist who was granted an exclusive interview with Jack L. Ruby by Chief Justica Harren. She allegedly died from a toxic combination of barbiturates and alcohol.

No new evidence was introduced during this television show and each penel member endeavors to support his own theories and observations. This television show will be recorded by the Laboratory Division and thereafter will be reviewed by the Domestic Intelligence Division, the Concret Investigative Division, and the Laboratory Division to determine if there is any daviation from the taped script the Bureau received.

The moderator for this show is Jim Bishop, syndicated columnist.

The New York Office, through established sources, obtained a transcript of this show which was recorded August 10, 1966, and it has been reviewed.

Your of the five authors participating in this show, namely, Mark Lane, Loo Sanvaço, Marold Weisberg, and Fonn Jones, have been critical of the findings of the Prosident's Constasion and have all published books cotting forth their opinions and observations based on the Complesion's findings. The moderator of the show, Jin Dishop, is on the Special Correspondent's List and has said that he is the only one on the show who "agrees with the Warren Commission Report on it stands."

The television enript that we received is 131 pages inliength. Some specific comments have been withfram to point out the inaccuracies and inconsistencies that exist among those panelists. On page 10, Mark Lane referred to a photograph of Les Harvey Cavald which shows him holding a rifle and he mentioned that opecial Agent Chancyfelt testified this picture had been altered and doctored. that this photograph had been "retouched" prior to publication in various magazines and newspapers and further the Cosmission determined the newspapers and publications retouched the photograph themselves and it was not the Burson.

On page 21, Weisberg counsented to the effect the assassination rifle reached the Laboratory without any night on it, that the sight was in an inoperative condition, and that the sight could never be made to operate. The rifle was received in the Leboratory and the telescopic sight was attached locaely to the rifle, but it is not known what condition the rifle and telescope combination were in at the time of recovery by the Deline volice Department.

Ca pages 25, 26, and 27, comments are made by both Leo Sauvage and Mark Lone regarding the assumition for the assaultation rifle. They were exploring the availability and reliability of the assumition used. Lane commented the Winchester-Wastern Company sent a letter in which they said because the assumition was old, it is now of questionshie reliability. The moderator, Jim mishop, commented, "Didn't the FBI test fire this thing the following day, asturday:" to which Lone replied, the Government did test the weapon "with this old Italian carbine assaunition ..."

The empunition of the type mentioned was excitable in Dallas, Texas. Accountion was used and test fired on humarous occasions by the Tall Laboratory and was found to be in excellent physical condition in every respect. Chronograph tests showed it to perform according to the specifications of the manufacturer. In addition, special Agent Robert A. Frazier of the Laboratory Division, testified effectively regarding this matter, including the firing and accuracy of the assassination rifle, before the Freedent's Commission on 3/31/64, which clearly established the weapon was a useful weapon. This information is contained in Volume III of the Bearings Refore the Freedent's Commission on the Assassination of Freedent Kennedy, commencing on page 390.

A point is elso made by the panelists concerning whether or not Lee Hervey Cawald was present in the window of the Texas School Ecok Repository Building from which the shots were fired. The President's Commission relied on Hr. Howard L. Brennen, yet the critical panelists attempted to discredit him

raying that he lied and also attempted to point out that due to the position of the sum, the height and opening of the window, it was questionable whether froman actually did see Seweld. They also go into considerable detail whether or not usuald was standing or in any other position, however, with all the observations the panelists made, Franca did identify les usarey Considerable even though he later admitted he withheld information due to fear that reprisels may have been taken equinat him and him family. The Commission went into this phase thoroughly and is explained when Noward L. Branca testified before the Commission on 1/24/64, which information appears in Volume III of the Hearings Before the Freedeact's Commission on the Assassination of Freedeact Kannady, beginning on page 140.

The panelists have tried to make a big issue out of the fact that numerous witnesses did not testify before the President's Commission. It must remain in mind that although numerous witnesses did not eppear before the President's Commission itself, which comprised only seven numbers, these witnesses were interviewed by either the Assistant Councels or Stelf numbers, and their testimony was officially recorded.

The punclists, and especially Mark Lane, discussed at great length the findings relating to the autopay as to whather the bound appearing in the front of the President's throat was an entrance or exit wound. Lone has, and continues, to ettempt to defend his theory that shots also came from another location other than the Texas Echool Book Depository Building which in reality would believe his theory that two or more assessing were involved in the assessination of Fresident Kennedy. In this respect, Mr. Jecob Cohen, who has assumed the position of defending the Fresident's Commission, made a clear resultable to those allegations.

Con pages 89 and 60 reference is made to the Espreder film which is the film taken by Mr. Abrahm Repreder and reveals the President being struck by the lathel bullet. Mr. Feisborg has contended this film was spliced and that some of the frames were removed, that this was corruption and destruction of essential evidence. On pages 61s and 61, Lone refers egain to the "Crville Wix film" and alleges the film was ruined by the FBI according to information Wix furnished to Lane. Lane said that "several frames were missing" from the film and alleges "it was the ruined film, the altered film, which was shown to the Commission." This allegation is completely false and again displays the irresponsible approach Lane and the other panelists have taken in Eurthering their own theories.

The Mix elmers was not destroyed by the rai Laboratory as Land elleged, as it was used during the re-enactment at Dallas and was working properly at that time and was in good operating condition when it left the Laboratory and was returned to Mr. Mix.

In connection with other photographs, Lane had made reference to a photograph made by shillip willis at the assausaination scare approximately five minutes after the shots were fired and states that one of the pictures taken by Willis rowaled an individual in the background possibly identical to work help. This is a completely irresponsible and untruthful statement as the doctors did not establish for certain that bullet had passed through the Prosident until Dr. Hunes' theory was confirmed by his telephone call with Dr. Forry in Pallas. Texas, on 11/23/63, following the completion of the autopsy. When the autopsy was completed on the night of 11/22/63, our regents left and were not apprised of the doctors' theories and the Europa was not ewere of the final autopsy results until received on 12/23/63. Therefore, the comments made by Cohen are without qualification.

It is noted the panelists make reference to the fact the Covernment suppressed the x-rays and photographs taken during the autopay. Since the time this show was recorded, these photographs and x-rays were made available to the National Archives and have since been reviewed by Commander Humes who has publicly stated they support his original conclusions reported to the Fresident's Commission.

During the latter portion of the progrem, Mr. Penn Jones, toltor of the "Midlothien Mirror," commented and expounded the theory there is scaething sinister in the fact that at least 14 people are now dead who he alleges had some extra knowledge or connection with Lee Hervey Cawald or Jack L. He indicated that when he writes his book, which may be in two years, that unless evidence to the contrary presents itself between them and now, he will support the Merren Commission Report and that hee Harvey Onwald "did it, and did it alone."
