Having just finished what I regard as the most intendely dishonewt book on the JFK assassination and larned from it that you had no connection with that at all and are quoted werbatim but never in your own name and then only in the the Ruby part, I write first to tell you you were lucky not to be among those Gerald Posner interviewed and then to ask if you can please try to learn from the ABA if they sponsored what is heavily misused throughout the book, a Failure Analysis Associates so-called the computer analysis of the shooting.

Gerald Posner, the author if you have not seen him on TV, is extraordinarily careful not to provide any meaningful description of Failure Analysis Associates other than to fill the need of his book. That alone prompts suspicion. He is likewaise careful to avoid even suggesting that this outfit had a client for what had to be an expensive job and if so who the client was.
