Whenever it is possible for you I'll appreciate it if you can arrange for the Archives to send me each and every pages the CIA disclosed. ^{Or tell me how to ask under the new system} I've written Woolsey about it. I asked for all of that years ago and no claim to any exemption was made. In fact, OS disclosed a memo to the general counsel it did not send him reporting that it had two files on me more than two decades ago. There are, as I laid out for him, prima facie cases of their interfering with my publishing here and abroad.

At some point while it is not likely that he'll respond, I should get a reply. I'd like to be prepared for it by knowing what they have disclosed.

I intend at the least to invoke The Privacy Act, my rights to which they denied me, by filing corrections and asking that they accompany every pages referring to me that I have any question about.

I think if they decline that might make a story.

And perhaps overworked Jim might be able to do something.

I do hope you are now well and that we see you soon.
