Warren Says Probe Renewal Not Needed

In Peru yesterday Chief Justice Earl Warren said he saw no reason to reopen the Warren Commission's investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy.

Meanwhile, in Mexico City, a Cuban exile leader claimed that the Mexican police and Cuban embassy in Mexico have information on Lee Harvey Oswald that furthers the New Orleans probe into the Kennedy murder.

Alberto Garcia Menocal, secretary-general of the Association of Businessmen, Industrialists and Professional Men of Cuba, declared that the Cuban embassy has not told "a fifth part" of its relations with Oswald before the death of Kennedy and he said the Mexican people have additional information on the Mexican activities of Oswald, the man identified by the Warren Commission as President Kennedy's assassin.

Warren, stopping in Lima on his tour of four South American capitals, said of the New Orleans probe, "I have not heard anything which would change the report in any way, shape or form."
