WARREN UNIT BACKED BY EDWARD KENNEDY

WASHINGTON, July 31 (UPI)—Senator Edward M. Kennedy said today that although he had not read the Warren Commission Report he was convinced Lee Harvey Oswald alone assassinated President Kennedy.

The 34-year-old Massachussetts Democratf said:

"I never read the Warren Commission Report. However, I am satisfied that it represents at least conclusively the results which I believe are accurate. I have not read it. And I do not intend to do so."

A recent book by Edward Jay Epstein, a Harvard University graduate student, said the Warren Report had been hastily prepared and was inaccurate and incomplete. Mr. Epstein concluded that the commission headed by Chief Justice Earl Warren had not proved its principal finding that Oswald had acted alone.

Richard N. Goodwin, a former speech writer and trouble-shooter for the late President, suggested last week that an independent panel look into the charges and, if necessary, that Congress establish a new board to seek new evidence.
