The authors included Mark Lane, attorney for Oswald's mother and author of "Rush to Judgment;" Leo Sauvage, correspondent for Le Figaro of Paris and author of "The Oswald Affair;" Harold Oswald Affair;" Harold Weisberg, author of "White-wash," and Penn Jones, editor of the Midlothian (Tex.) Mirror and author of "Forgive My Grief."

Also appearing was Jacob Cohen, who is writing a book defending the Warren Report. The program was moderated by Jim Bishop, author of a forthcoming book; "The Day Kennedy Was Shot."

The three-hour discussion brought out many disturbing points in the Warren Report together with charges that certain photographs were altered and even destroyed and the rifle said to have been found at the assassination scene may have been a substitute for the actual one found there by police.
