Warren on the Warren Commission Report

Chief Justice Earl Warren isn't overly perturbed by the continued criticism of the way the Warren commission conducted its investigation of the Kennedy assassination. The 75-year-old chairman of the investigating panel tells friends that there will always be unanswered questions, but that the evidence overwhelmingly supports the conclusion that Lee Harvey Oswald was the sole killer of President Kennedy. "I was a district attorney in California for twelve years," Warren reminded one Administration official recently, "and I tried a number of murder cases [an average of fifteen a year]. If I were still a district attorney and the Oswald case came into my jurisdiction, given the same evidence I could have gotten a conviction in two days and never heard about the case again."
