
Oswald's Widow Asked That Ruby Be Spared

Marina Oswald disclosed in testimony released yesterday that she had written a letter to attorneys prosecuting Jack Ruby asking that her husband's killer be spared the death penalty.

"It is simply that it is pity to—I feel sorry for another human life," she told the Warren Commission last February. "Because this will not return—bring back to life (President) Kennedy or the others who were killed."

Mrs. Oswald said at the time that she had not mailed the letter.
