
U. S. Red Called Assassination A Fascistic' Act

President Kennedy's assassination was the act of a "Fascist-minded person," not a "Communist-minded person," according to testimony by an official of the Communist party of the United States before the Warren Commission.

Arnold S. Johnson, director of the Communist party's Information and Lecture Bureau, said that "Communists just do not believe in assassination as a method of social change."

Johnson said that Oswald was not a Communist party member and that "no Communist of any character at any time" was involved with Oswald in a plot to kill the President.
